" An Act for registering the Prices at which Corn is fold in the feveral Counties of Great Britain, and the Quantity exported and imported," It was enacted, That the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, shall, from Time to Time, appoint a fit Person to receive at the Treasury such Returns of the Prices of Corn, and of the Quantity exported and imported, as by the faid Act are directed to be made; the first Appointment to be made before the first Day of August, 1770, and published Eight Times, at the least, in the London Gazette; Notice is therefore hereby given, in Pursuance of the faid Act of Parliament, that the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's Treatury have appointed William Cooke, Eiq; to receive, at the Treasury, such Returns of the Prices of Corn, and of the Quantitles exported and imported, as are directed by the faid Act of Parliament.
