Permit us therefore, Sir, to participate in the general Joy, this Day conspicuous in every Face, to fee their antient, supreme, constitutional, and so much wished for Court of Types ld, restored to its former, or rather, fuperior Dignity and Importance, under your Excellency's wife and judicious Direction.
