AT the Court at St. James's, the 1st Day of November, 1770,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 19th of last Month, to direct, that all Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes then arrived, or that should thereafter arrive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal and Ducal Prussia, Pomerania, Samogitia, Courland, and Livonia, should make their Quarantine for Forty Days, to commence and be computed from the Day each Ship should come to Anchor in the Place appointed for performing Quarantine, and not before, and should strictly conform themselves, in all Respects, to the Rules and Regulations thereby required to be observed:—His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth judge it probable, that the Infection now raging in divers Parts in Poland may be brought into this Kingdom by Means of sundry Commodities, the Produce of those Places, exported from Hamburg and Bremen; and doth hereby, with the Advice aforesaid, order, that the Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal and Ducal Prussia, Pomerania, Samogitia, Courland, and Livonia, be extended to all Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes coming from Hamburg and Bremen:—And His Majesty, with the Advice aforesaid, doth hereby further order, require, and command, that all Ships and Vessels whatsoever coming from Hamburg or Bremen, and all Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes on Board the same, that are already arrived, or shall hereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark or Man, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, and do strictly conform themselves, in all Respects, to the Rules and Regulations now in Force, and required to be observed by Ships and Vessels subject to Quarantine. — And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant-General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the said respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 19th Day of October last, to direct, that all Rags or Cotton-Wool im-

ported in Ships or Vessels not obliged to perform Quarantine, should nevertheless be unpacked, opened and aired for the Space of a Fortnight, in the Manner therein mentioned.—And whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the Rags so imported are frequently stowed in different Parts of the Ships among other Goods susceptible of Infection; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby revoke the said Order in Council of the 19th Day of October last: And the better to prevent the Infection, now raging at Constantinople and other Parts of the Levant, and in some Parts of Poland, from being brought into this Kingdom, His Majesty doth hereby, with the Advice of his Privy Council, order, That all Ships, and Vessels whatsoever, having Rags or Cotton-Wool on Board, that are already arrived, or shall hereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark or Man, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, and do likewise strictly conform themselves, in all Respects, to the Rules and Regulations now in Force, and required to be observed by Ships and Vessels subject to Quarantine. — And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant-General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the said respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

*Naples, October 9.* The same Sort of Encampment is preparing at Portici, as has been usual for two Years past in this Season.

*Stockholm, October 16.* The Prince Royal of Sweden, in Company with Prince Frederick his Brother, arrived here last Sunday; and it is reported their Royal Highnesses are next Thursday to take Leave of the Royal Family at Gripsholm, previous to their setting out on their Travels, and propose to set out for Copenhagen next Monday.

Baron Sprengporten, having been ordered to return immediately to his Post at Copenhagen, set out from hence last Saturday for that Place.

*Rotterdam, October 26.* The Magistrates of Dantzick have resolved not to admit of the Exportation of Rye and Wheat, till the Store of 600 Last of Rye and 3000 Last of Wheat is assembled in the City Store-houses for their own Consumption.

As by the Distress in Poland the Quantity of Corn for Exportation will be much less than in other Years, this has already had an Effect upon the Price of Corn, and particularly of Rye, in this Country.

A Scarcity of Salt in France has produced a Prohibition of the Exportation of that Commodity, and a Permission to import Salt from Spain and Portugal in French Bottoms.
