St. James's, November 27, 1770. IT is His Majefly's Pleasure, that all Officers, belonging to His Land Forces, serving in Ireland, do immediately repair to their respective Posts in that Kingdom, except fuch as are employed on the Recruiting Service.

Whitehall, November 20, 1770. BARON Nolchen, Envoy Extraordinary from bis Swedish Majesty, baving notified to me, by Order of his Court, that, on Account of the Plague raging in the Levant and in some Parts of Europe, no Ships or Travellers whatsoever would be admitted into the Ports or Frontiers of Sweden, without proper Bills of Health; this is to give Notice to all Owners and Masters of Ships, and others whom it may concern, that they may apply to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, and to the Principal Officers of the Customs in the Outports, for fuch Bills of Health.

HERE AS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twelsth Day of October last, to promise and declare, amongst other Things, that the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid to every for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid to every fuch Seaman respectively, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of this Instant, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds should be also paid to any Perfon who should, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of this Instant, discover any Seaman of Seamen who should conceal themselves, so that such Seamen or Seamen should be taken for this Majerty's faid Service. And whereas the Time thereby limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service; that the same should be continued for some longer Time; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited by the faid Procla mation for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid 30th Day of this Instant November, to the 31st Day of December next, inclusive. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly. W. Blair.
