By the KING, APROCLAMATION, For Encouraging Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS it is Our Royal Intention. to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Landmen, who shall voluntarily enter themselves in Our Service; We have thought sit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby promise and declare, That all such Able-Bodied Landmen, not above the Are of Thirty sive Years, por under the Ace of Age of Thirty-five Years, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Univey-first Day of December next, vo-luntarily cuter themselves to serve on Board Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Likute-nants of Our Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as shall be employed for raising. Men for the Service of Oar Nevy, shall receive, as Our Royal & Sunty, the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man; such Sum to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque refiding at the Ports or Places where the Ships, into which they shall be entered, hall be, immediately after the Third Muster of fuch Men. And for Prevention of any Abuses by any Persons leaving the Vessels to which they shall beloag, and entering themselves on Board any other Ships or Vesseis in order to obtain the faid Bounty Money; We do hereby declare and command, That fuch Men, belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffels, as shall absent themselves from any of the said Ships or Vessels to which they shall belong, and shall enter themselves on Board any other of Odraid Ships or Vessels in order to obtain the said slounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shall leave, but also be severally and shall leave, but also be severally and shall severally shall shall

feverely punished according to their Demerits.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 30th of last Month, to direct, that the Quarantine then subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from the common statement of the common statement of the council beautiful to the council the council to the co from Hamburgh and Bremen, should be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Vetfels should be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without opening, unpacking, and airing, and without performing any Quaran tine, provided that they have no Rags or Cotton-Wool on Board, and that the Maller, or other reformating Charge of such Ship or Vessel, do Persons making juch Discovery as after said, to be paid first make Oath before the Custom-House Osficer on the Conviction of any one or more of the Offender:

or Chief Magistrate, on their Arrival at the Place where they are bound to, that they did not touch at any Flace from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, nor had Communication with any Ship or Veffel subject thereto during the Voyage, and that the Crew are all in Health. And whereas His Majetty hath received Information, that Hemp, and Plax, and Human Hair, and Feathers, are frequently brought on board Ships coming from Hamburgh and Bremen, which Goods are likewife more especially liable to retain Insection; His Majefly, for the better preventing the Infection now raging in fome Parts of Poland from being brought into this Kingdom, is pleafed, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all Ships and Veffel's coming from Hamburgh or Bemen, and having Rags, Cotton-Wool, Hemp, or Flax; or Human Hair, or Feathers, on board, that are already arrived or field bereafter arrive. that are already arrived, or finall hereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the lifes of Je fey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, and do likewife firstly conform themselves, in all Respects, to the Rules and Regulations now in Force, and required to be observed by Ships and Vessels subject to Quarantine-And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majetty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant-General and the reit of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majetly's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the faid respective likes of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark and Mau, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
