The King has been pleafed to order a Congé dElire to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Ely, for Electing a Bishop of that See, the same being now void by the Death of the Right Reverend Father in God, Dr. Mathias Mawson, late Emop thereof: And also to order a Letter, recommending to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Father in God Dr. Edmund Keene, now Eishop of Chester, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Ely.

AT the Court at St. James's, the 21ft Day of December, 1770,

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majefty was graciously W pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bear-Date the Twelfth Day of October last, to promise and declare, amongst other Things, that the Boun-tes of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman, should be pad to every fuch Seaman respectively, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of November Iass, roluntarily enter themselves to serve in His Majesh's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Or-cinary Seaman, should also be paid to any Person, who should, on or before the said Thirtieth Day of November last, discover any Seaman or Seamen who should conceal themselves, so that such Seaman or Semen thould be taken for His Majetty's faid Service: The Time for the Payment of which Bountes and Rewards was afterwards prolonged to the Thirty-first Day of this Instant December. And whereas His Majesty was likewise pleased, by another Proclamation, bearing Date the Thirtieth Day of November last, to promise and declare, that a Bounty of Twenty Shillings should be paid to each Alle Redial I and the Redial I Able Bodied Landman not above the Age of Thirty-fre Years, nor under the Age of Twenty, who should, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of bis lastant December, voluntarily enter themselves to serve on Board His Majesty's Royal Navy, in the

Manner directed by the faid Proclamation. whereas the Time limited for paying the faid respective Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majeity's Service, that the fame should be continued for some longer Time; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid feveral Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant December, to the Fourteenth Day of February next, inclusive. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Whereas it bath been bumbly represented to the King, that on Friday the 14th Inflant, about Ten o'Clock at Night, some Person or Persons unknown did maliciously shoot in at the Window of the House of Mr. Thomas Wilks, of Brothertoft in the County of Lincoln, with a Gun loaded with Shot, and did then dangerously awound the faid Mr. Wilks, then futing by his Fire-Side, in the Left Cheek: His Majefly, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Perpetrators of this wicked Action, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually fired the Juid Cun) who shall discover his her or their Accompliance. bis, ber, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that be, she, or they may be apprehended and convided thereof.
