Berlin, February 2. Last Tuesday, the 29th of January, the Anniversary of the Birth-day of the Princess Dowager of Prussia, her Royal Highness received the Compliments of the Royal Family and Foreign Ministers; and, in the Evening, there was a great Supper and Ball in the Queen of Prussia's Apartments in the Palace. Yesterday Morning the Prince and Princess Royal of Prussia, who arrived here from Potzdam some Days ago, to pay their Respects on this Occasion to the Princess Dowager of Prussia, returned to Potzdam.

Yesterday, in the Evening, the Corpse of the late Sir Andrew Mitchell was deposited, in a private Manner, but with all becoming Decency and Decorum, in one of the Vaults of the principal French Church here of the Reformed Religion.

This Day a Chapter of the most Noble Order of the Garter was held in the Great Council-Chamber, when Granville Levison-Gower, Earl Gower, being first Knighted with the Sword of State, was afterwards elected, and invested with the Garter, Ribbon, and George, with the usual Solemnities.
