*St. James's, June 19.*

**A** Chapter of the most Noble Order of the Garter having been summoned to meet this Day, the Knights Companions, with the Officers of the Order hereafter mentioned, all in their Mantles, attended the Sovereign in his own Apartment; and, being called over by Garter King at Arms, a Procession was made from thence to the Great Council Chamber in the following Order:

Marquis of Rockingham.  
 Earl of Hertford.—Duke of Northumberland.  
 Duke of Montagu.  
 Duke of Newcastle.  
 His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester.  
 Black Rod.—The Register.—Garter King of Arms.  
 The Chancellor.  
 The SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and Knights Companions being seated, the Chancellor signified to the Chapter the Sovereign's Pleasure for filling up the vacant Stall; upon which the Chapter immediately proceeded to the Election, and his Royal Highness Frederick Bishop of Osnabrugh was declared duly elected, (having been knighted when he received the Order of the Bath;) whereupon his Royal Highness was received at the Chapter-Room Door by the Two Junior Knights Companions, and conducted to the Sovereign, preceded by Garter and Black Rod, the former carrying the Ensigns on a Cushion, which being presented by him to the Sovereign, His Majesty delivered the Garter to the Two Senior Knights, who buckled it on his Royal Highness's Left Leg, the Chancellor pronouncing the Admonition; then his Royal Highness kneeling down, His Majesty, with the Assistance of the Knights, put the Ribbon, with the George, over his Shoulder, the Chancellor pronouncing the Admonition; and his Royal Highness, having kissed the Sovereign's Hand, saluted the Knights Companions, and received their Congratulations, a Procession was made back to the King's Closet in the same Order it came from thence

*Copenhagen, June 8.* On Thursday last their Danish Majesties, attended by only a Part of their usual Suite, removed from hence to Hirschholm, where they propose to reside during the Summer.

*Dresden, June 12.* The very heavy Rains, which have lately fallen here, added to the Melting of the deep Snow in the Mountains of Bohemia, have caused the River Elbe to swell to a greater Height than has been known in the Memory of Man. The Torrent brought down so great a Quantity of Wood, and with such Force, that it was apprehended the great Bridge of this City would have been damaged, some of the smaller Bridges in the Country having been entirely swept away. It is thought the Produce of Corn will be greatly lessened this Year, as the Grain is so much beaten down by the Rain. This would not only be a very unfortunate Circumstance to the Inhabitants of Dresden and this Neighbourhood, but also to many other Parts of Germany; which are now reduced to such a Scarcity of Bread and Provisions as almost amounts to a Famine. Their Hope of obtaining Relief is, by the Exportation of Corn from Saxony, which must probably be prohibited for some Time, as Bread is now so dear in some Parts of the Elector's Territories, that the Workmen in the Mines at Freybergh have threaten-

ed an Insurrection unless the Price of Corn is reduced.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Thomas Patrick Young, Doctor in Divinity, the Place and Dignity of a Prebendary of the Collegiate Church of St. Peter, Westminster, void by the Resignation of Dr. Robert Fowler, late Prebendary thereof.
