To the KING's most Excellent Majesty.

Most gracious Sovereign,

WE Your Majesty's most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects, the Lord Mayor, Sheriffs, Commons, and Citizens, of the City of Dublin, in Common Council assembled, with Hearts impressed with the sincerest Affection for your Majesty, beg Leave to offer our Congratulations upon the Safety of Her Majesty, and the Increase of your Illustrious Family by the Birth of a Prince.

The most pleasing Sensations must arise in the Minds of your Majesty's Subjects by every Event which gives them and their Posterity a further Assurance of possessing those solid Advantages they have hitherto enjoyed under the auspicious House of Brunswick.

Permit us to assure your Majesty, that the same Loyalty and Attachment, for which this City hath ever been remarkable, shall be always exerted in the Support and Defence of your Majesty's Sacred Person and Government, and our happy Constitution.

In Testimony whereof we have caused the Common Seal of the said City to be hereunto affixed, this 21st Day of June, in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy One.

Mr. Freeman

If he now proceed in the Commission of Bankruptcy you have taken out against John Lamb your House shall be shut on Fire, and you in it by God you shunt live one Day as we are 100 Brave Boys that are for Lamb and will soon Murder you and all that offer to take Lambs Goods, and this believe from one of the Hundred whose Name is

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in such violent Proceedings, and in Writing the said threatening Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually wrote the said threatening Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
