His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in Writing and Dropping the said Letter, does hereby promise his most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover him, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
