Escorial, September 12.

HIS Catholick Majesty and the Royal Family arrived here Yesterday in the Morning. The Princess of Asturias is in perfect Health, not at all fatigued by her Journey from St. Ildephonso. Indeed every Precaution had been taken to make the Roads as good, and her Carriage as easy as possible. Her Royal Highness dined at Los Molinos.

Advice is received of the Arrival of the Ventura Frigate off Valdeparaiso, very richly laden. The Castle is to quit Vera Cruz in October, and is computed to be worth Seven Millions in Specie, and Three Millions in Merchandize. The Flota will not be ready to sail before the Spring.

Berlin, September 21. Yesterday the Regiments of Lottrum and Kofchenbar, Infantry; the Regiments of Gens d'Armes, and one Squadron of the Gardes du Corps, Cavalry; and the Regiment of Ziethen, Hussars; marched out of this Capital to Potsdam, in order to be reviewed and exercised there by his Prussian Majesty, together with the Garrison of that Place, and some other Regiments from the Garrison Towns in that Neighbourhood, as is usual at this Time of the Year.
