The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day the Right Honourable Sir Lawrence Dundas, Bart. was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Escurial, September 23. On Thursday last, the 19th Instant, about a Quarter after Five in the Afternoon, her Royal Highness the Princess of Asturias was safely delivered of a Prince. This happy Event has given the greatest Joy to his Catholick Majesty, the Royal Family, and the whole Court. The Princess and the young Prince are both as well as possible.

His Catholick Majesty had a few Days before received the News of the Grand Dutches of Tuscany's Delivery, and had ordered three Days of Gala; these were, on the present Occasion, converted into Days of Great Gala; and the Court, and all Persons who came to congratulate his Majesty, had the Honour of kissing his Hand. His Majesty was present at the Te Deum, which was sung on the 20th, in the Great Church of this Convent, and walked round it last Night to view the very fine Illuminations with which it was decorated.

All the Money, which had been, on similar Occasions, laid out in Publick Bull-Feasts and other Festivities, is now to be employed in Portions for unmarried Girls.

His Catholick Majesty daily receives Deputations from all Parts of his Dominions, to testify the Joy so justly felt by all his Subjects.
