On the 23d Instant, at Nine o'Clock in the Morning, his Royal Highness the Archduke Ferdinand, Governor and Captain-General of Austrian Lombardy, after taking Leave of their Imperial Majesties and all the Royal Family, went to his Coach, which waited for him at the Place called Spanier-Platz. His Royal Highness was attended thither by the Arch-duke Maximilian, and preceded by the Pages, Chamberlains, Privy Councillors,

Great Officers of their Majesties, and Captains of the Guards. His Royal Highness afterwards passed through the Great Square of the Court, where Detachments of the Noble German and Hungarian Horse Guards were drawn up with their Trumpets, as also the Foot Guards, the Grand Guard under Arms. His Royal Highness then passed through the Square of St. Michael, the Kolmarkt, the Graben, the Place called Stock am Eisen, and thro' the Street of Italy to the Gate of that Name. The Burghers Companies formed a double Line the whole Way; the Infantry and Cavalry of the Garrison were posted from the Gate of Italy as far as the Suburb of Marie-hulf, where a very great Multitude was assembled, who made the Air echo with their Acclamations. From this Place, his Royal Highness departed in the following Order, under a Salute of the Musquetry of a Battalion of Grenadiers posted on the Parade, near the Court, and of a Discharge of the Cannon of the Ramparts.

A Detachment of Hussars, two Postillions founding their Horns.

A Coach, wherein were the Counts de Broun, de Stampa, and de Sinzendorff.

Chamberlains to their Imperial Majesties and to their Royal Highnesses.

A Coach, wherein were Count de Hardegg, their Imperial Majesties Chamberlain, and First Equerry to his Royal Highness, with the Prince of Lamberg and Count de Saim, also their Majesties Chamberlains.

A Post-Master on Horseback.

A Coach, in which was his Royal Highness the Archduke, and opposite to him the Prince of Paar, Post-Master General, and the Count Sigismund de Kevenhuller-Metsch, his Royal Highness's Great Master of the Household.

Two Noble Hungarian Guards.

A Cabinet Courier.

A Postillion of the Court, and one of the Imperial Post.

The Confessor, Physician, Treasurer, and Privy Purse.

His Royal Highness left Part of his Retinue at Buckerstorff, to travel with the greater Expedition by the Way of St. Polten to Marie-Zell, and from thence through Pruck to Loeben, where the rest of his Attendants will join him.
