THE last Letters from Prague mention, that the Price of all Sorts of Grain is increasing again; and the Cafe is the same in the Markets here. One Reason is, that the Experience of three Years Distress and Want of Corn makes every Body desirous of taking Precautions to reserve Part of the Produce of this Harvest, for Fear the next Year's should not prove so plentiful.
