PRESZNT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act of Parliament paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled, " An Act " to oblige Ships more effectually to

" perform their Quarantine, and for the better Pre-" venting the Plague being brought from Foreign " Parts into Great Britain or Ireland, or the Illes " of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man," It is among many other Things Enacted, That all Ships and Veffels arriving, and all Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain or Ireland, or any of the lifes aforementioned, from any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs, or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, thall judge it probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in fuch Place and Places, for fuch Time, and in fuch Manner, as has been, or shall, from Time to Time, be directed by His Majesty, His Heirs, or Succeffers, by His or Their Order or Orders made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, shall have respectively performed, and be discharged from, such Quarantine, no such Person, Goeds, or Merchandizes, or any of them, shall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on Board any other Ship or Vef-fel in any Place within His Majefty's Dominions, unlefs in fuch Manner, and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence, as fhall be directed or per-mitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His Heirs, or Successors, in Council as aforefaid : And that all fuch Ships and Veffels, and the Perfons or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being out on Board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats, and Perfons, receiving any Goods or Perfons out of the fame, shall be subject to such Orders, Rules, and Directions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or fhall be made by His Majefty, His Heirs, and Succeffors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned. under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid Act.

And whereas Information has been received, that the Plague hath broken out, and now rages at Mof. cow, and other Farts of Ruffia ; and His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon judge it probable, that the Infection may be brought into this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from Archangel, Petersburgh, Narva, Riga, or some other Port or Place in the Dominions of Ruffia ;- His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That all Ships, Vef-

this Kingdom, or the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from Archangel, Peters-burgh, Narva, Riga, or from any other Port or Place in the Dominions of Russia, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, which is to commence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Vessel shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for performing Quarantine, and not before.

That the Place for performing Quarantine by fuch Ships and Veffels (not having the Infection on board) as are bound to the Rivers of Thames and Medway, be Standgate Creek, and by fuch as are bound to any other of the Ports of Great Britain, be fuch Places as shall be appointed by the Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms in the faid Ports ; who are hereby impowered and required to appoint proper Places for the fame. And that the Places for per-forming Quaraatine, within any Part of the faid Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, be fuch Places as shall be appointed by the respective Governors of the faid respective Isles, who are hereby impowered and required to appoint proper Places for the fame.

That no Pilot shall go on board any Ship or Vessel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the fame into any Port or Place, but shall perform fuch Service in fome other Boat or Veffel, which Boat or Veffel shall keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Veffel to to be conducted as poffible; and if any Pilot, or other Perfon, fhall go on board fuch. Ship or Veffel, fuch Pilot, or other Person, shall perform Quarantine, in like Manner as any Person coming in such Ship or Vessel

fhall be obliged to perform the fame. That all Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, fhall be opened, uppacked, and aired, unless His Majesty shall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherways, and fo remain a Week ; other than Hemp, and Flax, Paper, and Books, Silk raw, thrown, or wrought, Linnen, Cotton Wool, Cotton Yarn, or manufactured, Wool raw, or any wife wrought, Feathers, Grograin, or Mohair Yarn, Hu-man Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil in Chefts, Thread-Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats, and Brushes, Matting, and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes, fo as aforefaid enumerated, are to be opened, unpacked, and aired, unless His Majesty shall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherways, and so remain for the Space of a Fortnight.

That all Goods imported by fuch Ships and Veffels as are to be bound for the Rivers Thames and Medway, be aired on board a floating Lazaret, which is appointed for that Service in Standgate Creek; and that the Places for airing Goods that fhall be imported in Ships bound to any other Ports of Great Britain, be fuch as shall be appointed by the Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms; and that the fels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, now ar- Places for airing the Goods imported into any of the faid

faid Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, be such Places as shall be appointed by the Governors or Commanders in Chief of the faid refpective Ifles upon the Spot, who are hereby impowered and required to appoint proper Places for the fame. .

That whatfoever Ship or Perfon shall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Ship or Veffel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That fuch Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, shall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Vessel, for the taking any Goods not liable to retain In-fection, from the Goods and Merchandizes before enumerated, shall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine.

That the Captains of every of His Majesty's Ships of War, who shall meet any fuch Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain, or Ireland, or of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, shall take due Care to prevent the landing any Godds, Seamen, or Paffengers, from on Board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms.

That the Commiffioners and other Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine, before directed, be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majefty's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majefty's Forts and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coafts, and all the Juffices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Constables, Headboroughs, Tything-Men, and all other Officers and Minifters of Juffice be aiding and affitting to the faid Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms, and to all others that fhall be concerned in ftopping all fuch Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Of . fice of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respectives Isles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

Dublin, November 5, 1771.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of the Birth of King William the Third of glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower; at Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Perfons of Diffinction, at the Caftle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; after which his Excellency, attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and efcorted by a Squadron of Horfe, went in Procession round the Statue of King William, the Regiments on Dublin Duty lined the Statue on each Side; and, after his Excellency's Return to the Caffie, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majefty's Park the Phœnix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrilon, which were drawn up in College Green: In the Evening there was a Ball given by his Excellency for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

Act of Parliament passed in the 8th Year of His prefent Majesty, viz. "And be it further enacted, by the Authority

aforefaid, that no Perfon or Perfons shall fell the the Chance or Chances of any Ticket or Tickets in the faid Lottery, or any Share or Shares of any Ticket or Tickets in the faid Lottery, for a Day or Part of a Day, or for a longer Time lefs than the whole Time of drawing the Lottery then to come, or shall receive any Money whatsoever in Confideration of the Re-payment of any Sum or Sums of Money, in Cafe any Ticket or Tickets in the faid Lottery shall prove fortunate, or shall lay any Wager relating to the Time of fuch Ticket or Tickets being drawn, or whether fuch Ticket or Tickets be drawn fortunate or unfortunate; and all and every Perfon and Perfons, who shall offend in any of the faid Matters, shall forfeit and pay treble the Sum and Sums of Money which shall have been received by fuch Perfon or Perfons contrary to the true Intent and Meaning of this Act, to be recovered by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint or Information, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record at Westminster ; in which no Effoin, Protection, Privilege, or Wager of Law, or more than one Imparlance shall be allowed; one Moiety whereof to be for the Use of His Majesty, His Heirs, or Succeffors, and the other Moiety to be paid to the Perfon or Perfons who shall fue for the fame; and every fuch Wager, Sale, or Contract, and every Agreement relating thereto, shall be, and is hereby declared null and void."

" And be it enacted, by the Authority aforefaid, that if any Perfon or Perfons shall keep any Office or Offices, or shall print or publish any Scheme or Proposal for receiving any Sum or Sums of Money in Confideration of any Interest to be granted for the fame, in any Ticket or Tickets in the faid Lottery, whereof fuch Perfon or Perfons thall not then be actually poffeffed, or in Confidera. tion of any Sum or Sums of Money to be repaid. in Cafe any Ticket or Number of Tickets in the faid Lottery, which shall not be in the actual Possession of fuch Perfon and Perfons, shall prove fortunate or unfortunate; all and every fuch Perfon or Perfons thall forfeit and pay the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds, to be recovered by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, or Information, in any of His Majefty's Courts of Record at Westminster, in which no Effoin, Protection, Wager of Law, or more than one Imparlance shall be allowed; one Moiety whereof to be for the Use of His Majesty, His Heirs, or Succef-fors, and the other Moiety to be paid to the Person or Perfons who shall fue for the fame, and also shall fuffer three Months Imprifonment without Bail or Mainprize."
