HEREAS by an Act of Parliament paffed in the 1 wenty-fixth Year of His late Majerty's Reign, initialed, "An Act " to oblige Ships more effectually to " perform their Quarantine, and for the better Pre-

" venting the Plague being brought from Foreign " Pa.ts into Great Britain or Ireland, or the liles " of Guerniey, Jeriey, Alderney, Sark, or Man," It is among many other Things Enacted, That all Ships and Veffels arriving, and all Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain or Ireland, of any of the Ifles aforementioned, from any Place from whence His Majetty, His Heirs, or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, fhall judge it probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in fuch Place and Places, for tuch Time, and in fuch Manner, as has been, or shall, from fime to Time, be directed by His Majefty, Eis Heirs, or Succeffors, by His or Their Order or Orders made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by fructamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goous, and Merchandizes, shall have respectively. performed, and be discharged from, fuch Quarantine, no such Person, Goods, or Merchandizes, or any of them, mail come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on Board any other Ship or Vef-fel in any Place within His Majefly's Dominions, unlefs in such Manner, and in fuch Cafes, and by such Licence, as shall be girected or perinitied by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs, or Succeffors, in Council as aforelaia : And that all fuch Ships and Veffels, and the Perions or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on Board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats, and Perfons, receiving any Goods or Perfons out of the fame, shall be subject to such Orders, Rules, and Directions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or Thail be made by His Majeity, His Heirs, and Succeflors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned, under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the inid Aft.

And whereas Information has been received, that the Plague hath broken out, and now rages at Mafcow, and other Farts of Ruffia; and His Majefty, by and with the Advice of Fiis Vrivy Council, doth thereupon judge it probable, that the Infection may be brought into this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from Archangel, Feteriburgh, Narva, Riga, or fome other Port or Place in the Dominions of Ruffia; - His Ma-

jefly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That all Ships, Veffels, Perions, Gocds, and Merchandizes, now arrived, or that thall hereafter arrive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, sark, or Man, from Archangel, Peteriburgh, Narva, Riga, or from any other Fort or Place in the Dominions of Ruffia, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, which is to commerce and be computed from the Day each Ship or Veffel thall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for performing Quarantine, and not before.

That the Place for performing Quarantine by fuch Ships and Veffels (not having the Infection on board) as are bound to the Rivers of Thames and Medway, be Standgate Creek, and by fuch as are bound to any other of the Ports of Great Britain, be fuch Places as shall be appointed by the Officers of His Majefty's Cultoms in the faid Ports; who are hereby impowered and required to appoint proper Places for the fame. And that the Places for performing Quarantine; within any Port of the faid Ifles of Jeriey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, be fuch Places as shall be appointed by the respective Governors of the faid respective Ifles, who are hereby impowered and required to appoint proper Places for the faid.

That no Pilot shall go on board any Ship or Vessel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the fame into any Port or Plate, but shall perform such Service in some other Boat or Vessel, which Boat or Vessel shall keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Vessel to to be conducted as possible; and if any Pilot, or other Person, shall go on board such Ship or Vessel, such Pilot, or other Person, shall perform Quarantine, in like Manner as any Person coming in fuch Ship or Vessel shall be obliged to perform the same

fhall be obliged to perform the fame That atl Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, fhall be opened, unpacked, and aired, unlefs His Majefty fhall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherways, and fo remain a Week; other than Hemp, and Flax, Paper, and Books, Silk raw, thrown, or wrought, Linnen, Cotton Wool, Cotton Yarn, or manufactured, Wool raw, or any wife wrought, Feathers, Grograin, or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil in Chefts, Thread-Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats, and Brufnes, Matting, and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes, fo as aforelajd enumerated, are to be opened, unpacked, and aired, unlefs His Majefty fhall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherways, and fo remain for the Space of a Fortnight.

That all Goods imported by fuch Ships and Veffels as are bound for the Rivers of Thames and Medway, be aired on board a floating Lazaret, which

which is appointed for that Service in Standgate Creek; and that the Places for airing Goods that fhall be imported in Ships bound to any other Ports of Great Britain, be fuch as fhall be appointed by phe Officers of His Majefly's Cultors; and that the Places for airing the Goods imported into any of the flaid Illes of Guernfey, Jerley, Alderney, Sark, or Man, be fuch Places as fhall be appointed by the Governors or Commanders in Chief of the faid refpective Illes upon the Spot, who are hereby impowered and required to appoint proper Places for the fame.

That whatfoever Ship or Perfon fhall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Ship or Veffel under Quarantine, fhall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That such Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, fhall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Vessel, for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection, from the Goods and Merchandizes before enumerated, shall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine.

That the Captains of every of His Majefty's Ships of War, who fhall meet any fuch Ship or Veffel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain, or Ireland, or of the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, fhall take due Care to prevent the landing any Goods, Seamen, or Paffengers, from on Board the fame, until they fhall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms.

That the Commissioners and other Officers of His Majefty's Customs do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine, before directed, be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majefly's Ships of War, as likewile the Commanders of His Majefly's Forts and Garrifons lying near, the Sea Coafts, and all the Juffices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magiltrates, Confables, Headboroughs, Tything-Men, and all other Officers and Minifters of Juffice be aiding and affitting to the faid Officers of His Majefly's Cuttoms, and to all others that fhall be concerned in flopping all fuch Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majelty's Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Of fice of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majelty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respectives Isles of Jersey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necellary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Yesterday Morning about Four o'Clock the Post-Boy driving the Mail-Carriage with the North-Road Mails from this Office, was attacked and robbed by two Men on Foot near Houndsfields, about Seven Miles and an Half from London on the Road to Endfield, who prefented a Pistol to the Boy, and ordered him to drive into an inclosed Field fome Distance from the Road, where, after binding his Hands and Legs, and leaving him about Thirty Yards from the Carriage, they cut and broke open the Roof of it, and fiele thereout the whole North Mail except the St. Iwes Bag; and in the Afternoon the greater Pars of the Bags were found unopened in a Ditch not far from the Place where the Robbery was committed, and were immediately forwarded from hence by Express, but the following Bags of Letters are fill missing, vize.
