The Viscount d'Herreria and his Lady arrived here last Night from Russia, and he has this Morning presented his Credentials to the President of the Week, as Minister Plenipotentiary from his Catholic Majesty to the States-General.

Their High Mightinesses, on Account of the Dearness of Provisions, have forbidden, under severe Penalties, the Exportation of Potatoes from their Territories, for the Space of one Year.
