Pisa, November 18.

HIS Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester is just arrived here from Leghorn, and seems to be perfectly recovered from his late dangerous Illness.

Warsaw, November 16. His Polish Majesty is still confined to his Chamber, but it is thought that in a few Days he will be able to go abroad.

Stockholm, November 19. Last Week the States were only once assembled in Pleno, when a Report was read from the Secret Committee, proposing, that all Foreign Ships might have the Liberty to import Corn to Gottenburg, Marstrand, or other Swedish Ports situated upon the Northern or Western Ocean, free of all Duties, which was agreed to by all the Orders; but, as there was some Difference in their Resolutions, whether it should be limited to the first of March, or till the End of March, we must wait till the Ordinance is published before the Time can be determined.

Two Projects were read the same Day in the House of Nobles for a new Representation to be made to the other Orders, with regard to the Additions to the King's Affurances; but nothing was resolved upon either of them, and they lie upon the Table till the next Plenum.

Vienna, November 20. His Imperial Majesty returned hither on Sunday last in good Health from his Progress through Moravia, Bohemia, and Upper Austria.

Brussels, December 3. The Distemper amongst the horned Cattle still continues with some Degree of Violence in these Countries:

Yesterday a Chapter was held at the Prince of Stahremberg's, when Mess. de Wavrans and Vilaine were created Knights of the Order of St. Stephen.
