Stockholm, December 3.

THE States were twice assembled in Pleno last Week; in the first of which, the Reply of the three inferior Orders to the Representation of the Nobility, with regard to the King's Assurances, was brought to the House of Nobles; and it was proposed by Major-General Frederick Horn, that a Deputation of two or three hundred Persons, with the Marshal of the Dyet at their Head, should be sent to the other Orders: But this Proposition was opposed, as being contrary to the Ordinance of the Dyet, and was laid upon the Table to be debated another Time.

In the second, which was held last Saturday, a Report was read from the Secret Committee, proposing, by the Advice of the Senate, that the free Importation of Corn from Abroad, in Foreign as well as Swedish Ships, should be extended to the End of the Month of May, according to the Resolution of the Orders of Clergy and Peasants; to which the Nobles and Burghers having agreed, it is expedited accordingly.
