THE last Intelligence from Moscow is extremely favourable; the Distemper being so much diminished, that Shops are again opened in that City, and People go about their Business as usual.

On Monday last Count de Scheel, Envoy from the Court of Denmark to the Empress of Russia, died here of a Bilious Fever, universally regretted.

Berlin, December 14. This Morning the King of Prussia, attended by Lieutenant General Lentulus, arrived here in perfect Health, from Potsdam.
