Constantinople, November 18.

**O**N the 6th Instant there was a Fire in this City, which consumed near an Hundred Houfes; amongst which were those of the Reis Effendi, the Mecktugbi, and some other Officers of the Porte. And on Saturday, at Midnight, another Fire broke out here, which burnt with great Fury, in a strong Gale of Wind, for ten Hours, and consumed an infinite Number of Houfes, having burnt near half a Mile in Length.

Warsaw, November 30. His Polish Majesty still keeps his Chamber, the Wound on his Head not being yet healed; but, as his Majesty has at present no other Complaint, it is hoped he will soon be able to appear in Publick.

Petersburg, December 3. All the Letters from Moscow now agree, that the Disease there is greatly decreased: One Letter brings an Account, that the Deaths in a Day, throughout the whole City, did not amount to more than 73, and the Frost being set in (the Neva having been frozen ever since the 23d of last Month) will, it is hoped, contribute to eradicate the Malady, which the Departure of Count Orloff, who is said to be on his Return hither, seems to corroborate it.

Prince Volkonsky is appointed Governor of Moscow, and is gone thither.

Vienna, December 11. On Sunday last his Excellency Count Gallenberg, who was formerly Governor to the Archduke Maximilian, was appointed Grand Master of his Royal Highness's Household, and presented as such, with the usual Ceremonies, by Prince Khevenhuller, Grand Master of their Imperial Majesties Household, before whom he took the accustomed Oath.

The King has been pleased to appoint Hugh Palliser, Esq; Sir John Williams, Knt. Edmund Mason, Timothy Brett, Thomas Hanway, William Bateman, Esqrs. Sir Richard Temple, Bart. Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That John Perrin, of Rothersfield Grays in the County of Oxford, Blacksmith, went from Home on Friday the 9th of November last, to Henley upon Thames, where he staid some Hours, and was seen there between Nine and Ten in the Evening, but has not been since heard of; therefore there is great Reason to suspect that the said John Perrin has been murdered: If any Person will give Intelligence where the said John Perrin now resides, (if alive) he shall receive a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS, on Application to Mr. Newell, Town Clerk of Henley upon Thames: And, if it shall appear that the said John Perrin is murdered, His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in such Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually committed the said Murder) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or accomplices in the same, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
