Munich, December 19.

AN Express arrived here on the 17th, with Advice of the Decease of the Archbishop of Saltzbourg, on the preceding Day, in the 74th Year of his Age.

Berlin, December 21. Last Monday the Carnival Diversions began here with the Opera of Pyramus and Thisbe, which was performed in the Little Theatre in the Palace. On Tuesday there was a Ridotto in the Opera House; Wednesday an Italian Comic Opera was acted at the Little Theatre in the Palace; Thursday Evening there was a brilliant Court, and a splendid Supper in the Queen's Apartments; and Yesterday Evening, Britannicus, a Serious Opera, was acted at the Theatre in the Opera House.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint Herman Katenkamp, Esq; to be Consul in Sicily and the adjacent Islands.

St. James's, December 28, 1771.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That John Perrin, of Rotherfield Grays in the County of Oxford, Blacksmith, went from Home on Friday the 9th of November last, to Henley upon Thames, where he staid some Hours, and was seen there between Nine and Ten in the Evening, but has not been since heard of; therefore there is great Reason to suspect that the said John Perrin has been murdered: If any Person will give Intelligence where the said John Perrin now resides, (if alive) he shall receive a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS, on Application to Mr. Newell, Town Clerk of Henley upon Thames: And, if it shall appear that the said John Perrin is murdered, His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in such Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually committed the said Murder) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices in the same, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

N. B. The aforementioned John Perrin is about 60 Years of Age, luffy, and about five Feet ten Inches high; he had on a dark-coloured Thickset Frock, black Waistcoat, and Leather Breeches; wore his own dark brown Hair, and had a Scar on his Left Cheek.
