Before they separated, they took an unanimous Refolution, that the Laft Plenum before the Holidays should be To morrow; and the First after the Holidays, on the 8th of January. A great Number of the Members of the Diet are already gone out of Town.

The King will go into the Country on Friday for Fourteen Days, and his Majesty has invited feveral Gentlemen and Ladies of the First Distinction in Sweden, to the Number of about Forty, to pafs the Holidays with him at Eckholmfund.

That if any Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes shall be shipped or put on board, to be carried forth to the open Sea, from any one Port, Creek, or Member in this Kingdom, to be landed at any other Place of this Realm, without a Sufferance or Warrant first had and obtained from the Officers of His Majesty's Customs, all fuck Wares and Merchandizes shall be forstited and loss and that the Master of every Ship or Vessel that shall lade or take in any such Goods, Wares, or Merchandizes, shall, before the Vessel be removed or carried out of the Lading-Port, take out a Cocquet or Cocquets, and become bound to His Majesty, with good Security, in the Value of the Goods, for the Delivery thereof in the Port or Place for which the fame shall be entered, or in some other Port or Place within Great Britain, and to return a Certificate thereof in Six Months from tho Date Sinch Security bath been given.

And, by another Act paffed in the 11th Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, to continue the Probibition of the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Meal, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, and Starch, it is by the 4th Section enacted, that the faid Act shall not extend to prohibit any Perfor or Perfons to ship or put on board any of the Commodities aforefaid, to be carried Coastwife from any Port, Creek, or Member of Great Britain to any other Port, Creek, or Member of the fame respectively, having such like Coast Cocquet or Sufferance for that Purpole, and fuch or like Security being first given for the landing and difcharging the fame in fome other Port, Member, Creek of the faid Kingdom, and returning a Certificate in Six Months, as is required by Law in Cafes where Goods, which are liable to Duties on Exportation, are carried Coaftwife from one Port of Great-Britain to another.

And whereas feveral Masters of Coasting Vessel have lately taken on board great Quantities of Corn and other Grain at some of the Out-Ports of this Kingdom, which have exceeded the Quantity for which any Sufferan ferances have been granted, or any Security given, purfuant to the Direction of the Acts before-mentioned; which Practice thereby affords an easy Opportunity to export the faid Corn, Sc. to Foreign Parts, contrary to the Intent of the faid last recited Act.

The Commiffioners of His Majefly's Cuftoms, that no Perfon may pretend Ignorance in this Cafe, do bereby give Notice, that all Corn and other Goods which shall be shipped, to be brought Coasswife, without such Sufferance, and before such Security is given, will be seized and profecuted according to Law.
