And whereas several Mosters of Coasting Vessels have lately taken on board great Quantities of Corn and other Grain at some of the Out-Ports of this Kingdom, which have exceeded the Quantity for which any Sufferances have been granted, or any Security given, pursuant to the Direction of the Acts before-mentioned; which Practice thereby affords an easy Opportunity to export the said Corn, &c. to Foreign Parts, contrary to the Intent of the Said last recited AA.

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that no Person may pretend Ignorance in this Case, do hereby give Notice, that all Corn and other Goods which shall be shipped, to be brought Coast wife, without such Sufferance, and before such Security is given, will be seized

and prosecuted according to Law.
