Petersburg, December 27.

NOTHING can be more favorable than all the Accounts relative to the State of Health at Moscow, and to the Progress made in suppressing the Distemper every where else.

Pisa, January 3. On New Year's Day there was a Gala at Court; on which Occasion the Great Duke received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, and permitted his Subjects of Condition to kiss his Hand as usual; but the Great Dutchess, being a little indisposed, did not appear in Publick; she has, however, been out since to take the Air.

Stockholm, January 14. There was no Plenum last Wednesday as had been expected; the Marshal of the Dyet and the Speakers of the other three Orders agreed to defer it till To-morrow, on Account of the Number of Members which were still absent; but the Secret Committee and other Deputations have been assembled.

Last Saturday the King and Royal Family returned to Town from Eckholmsund, and were Yesterday at the Comedy for the first Time since the late King's Death.

Dresden, January 19. On Tuesday last their Highnesses Prince George Augustus of Mecklenburg Strelitz, and Prince Victor Amadee, of Anhalt Bernbourg, arrived here from Vienna.

Berlin, January 18. This being the Birth-Day of his Royal Highness Prince Henry of Prussia, when that Prince entered into the 47th Year of his Age his Royal Highness received from the Royal Family, Nobility, and Foreign Ministers here, the Compliments usual on the Occasion. His Prussian Majesty, in Honor of the Day, gave a splendid Dinner, in his Apartments, to his Brother Prince Henry, and to the Rest of the Royal Family.

Berlin, January 21. Last Sunday Morning his Prussian Majesty appeared, for the first Time since his late Illness, at his Levee, which was very numerous. All the Foreign Ministers residing at this Court were present.

Brussels, January 24. Last Week her Royal Highness the Princess Charlotte arrived here from Mons, and will remain here with her Brother during the Carnival. We were greatly alarmed here on Account of the late Indisposition of the Empress-Queen, but Yesterday his Royal Highness received a Letter from her Majesty, assuring him of her perfect Recovery.
