Westminster, February 15.

LAST Night the Corpse of her late Royal Highness the Princess Dowager of Wales was carried from Carlton-House to the Prince's Chamber, where the Body lay in State this Day, and will be interred, about Ten o'Clock at Night, in the Royal Vault in King Henry the Seventh's Chapel.

The Particulars of the Ceremonial of the Interment will be inserted in the next Gazette.

St. James's, February 15.

By His Majesty's Ship Florida, arrived at Spithead, a Letter has been received from Captain Burr, of His Majesty's Sloop the Hound, dated at Port Egmont in Falkland's Island, the 10th of November last, giving an Account that, in the preceding Month, two Spanish Vessels had arrived there with such Artillery, Stores, &c. which could not be restored to Captain Stott at the Surrender of the Island; and that a Spanish Commissary, appointed for this Purpose, had delivered them to Captain Burr with the greatest Punctuality and Exactness.

Naples, January 14. The Air of this Place seems to have a favourable Influence on his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester's Health, which improves daily.

The Court came to Town from Portici on Friday last, and the next Evening his Royal Highness paid his Compliments to the King and Queen of the Two Sicilies, who received him with every Demonstration of Friendship and Cordiality; and their Majesties conducted his Royal Highness to the Private Theatre of the Court, where a Comic Opera was performed by a Company brought for that Occasion from one of the Publick Theatres. His Royal Highness afterwards supped with their Majesties, where every Thing was conducted with the greatest Ease and Politeness. On Sunday Evening his Royal Highness went to the Great Theatre, which was illuminated, it being the King's Birthday; on which Occasion there was in the Morning Grand Gala at Court, when his Majesty received the Compliments of the Principal Nobility and Foreign Ministers. Twenty-one Guns were fired in Honour of the Day by His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Alarm, then riding in the Port.

Florence, January 25. On the 15th Instant the Great Duke and Dutchess returned hither from Pisa, in perfect Health, attended by their respective Retinues and Ministers; and were followed by the Foreign Ministers a few Days after.

On the 20th, being the Birth-day of the King of Spain, and of the Duke of Parma, the Nobility appeared at Court in Gala, and the Foreign Ministers complimented the Great Duke on the Occasion; and Marquis Viviani, the Spanish Envoy, entertained the Foreign and Tuscan Ministers at Dinner. In the Evening the Nobility entertained the Great Duke and Dutchess with a Ball at their Casino, in Mask.

Lisbon, January 26. Their most Faithful Majesties, and all the Royal Family, and the whole Court, are settled at Salvaterra, which is between thirty and forty Miles distant from this City, and they are not expected to return from thence till towards Lent.

Stockholm, January 28. The States were assembled in Pleno last Wednesday, when the Three Or-

ders of Clergy, Burghers, and Peasants, nominated General Rudbeck to be Governor of the City of Stockholm, and the two former sent Deputations to notify it to the House of Nobles; but this last has not yet taken it into Consideration.

This Evening there will be a Publick Ball in the Queen's Apartment for the first Time since the late King's Death.

Berlin, February 1. Last Wednesday, being the Birth-day of the Princess Dowager of Prussia, her Royal Highness received the Compliments usual on the Occasion, and in the Evening there was a grand Supper, and afterwards a Ball in the Queen of Prussia's Apartments. The next Morning the Prince and Princess Royal of Prussia returned to Potsdam.
