*Naples, January 28.*

**T**HE Air of this Place continues to agree perfectly well with his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester; though the Air is, and has been, for some Time, unfavourable. His Royal Highness was at Caserta, Thursday and Friday last, on a Visit to their Sicilian Majesties, who received him with the greatest Marks of Friendship and Politeness.

*Florence, February 4.* The excessive Rains, which have been almost continual for above a Month past, have done very great Damage in many Parts of this State, as well as all over Italy.

*Turin, February 8.* The Quantity of Snow that has lately fallen on the Mountains is astonishing and unusual: Mount Cenis has more than once been totally impassable for four or five Days; and the Snow is said to lie, in many Places, fifty Feet deep.

*Dunkirk, February 20.* This Day a Placard was fixed up in different Parts of the Town, prohibiting the Exportation of several Kinds of Provisions, on Account of their high Price and great Scarcity. This is the first Instance of a Prohibition of this Nature becoming necessary in any Part of Flanders. Hitherto the Market of this Place, on Account of the Shipping and great Concurrence of Strangers, has ever been considered by the Country People as the greatest Resource they had to dispose of their Provisions, which they are now obliged to withhold, from a real Scarcity of the Necessaries of Life.
