**T**HE Secret Committee having resolved, that it was impossible, in the present Situation of the Finances, to grant to the three Senators, who have demanded to resign, any more than 12,000 Dollars a Year, those Gentlemen have accepted that Pension; and their Petition being sent to the Plena, is this Day under Consideration in the House of Nobles, where it has laid upon the Table since Saturday last.

Major General Durietz set out on Sunday for Finland, in Consequence of a Resolution taken by the Secret Committee to send him into that Province, to examine into the Necessity and Nature of the Line formed upon the Frontiers, by General Ehrenswerd; and afterwards he is to proceed to Petersburg, to concert with that Court what is proper to be done in Case the Infection should appear again in the Spring.

General Durietz also carries the late King's Order of St. Andrew, in order to return it to the Empress of Russia.
