Dublin Castle, May 15, 1772.

THIS Day his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers, with the usual Solemnity, and, the Commons being sent for, gave the Royal Assent to the following Bills:

An Act for the further Improvement of His Majesty's Revenue, and the more effectual preventing of Frauds therein; and for continuing and amending several Laws heretofore made, and now in Force, relative to His Majesty's said Revenue.

An Act for explaining and amending a Proviso or Clause contained in an Act passed in the fourteenth and fifteenth Years of the Reign of King Charles the Second, intituled, An Act for settling the Subsidy of Poundage, and granting a Subsidy of Tonnage, and other Sums of Money, unto His Royal Majesty, His Heirs, and Successors, the same to be paid upon Merchandizes imported and exported into or out of the Kingdom of Ireland, according to a Book of Rates hereunto annexed.

An Act to prevent Frauds committed by Bankrupts.

An Act for rendering Securities by Mortgage more effectual.

An Act for the better preventing of Frauds committed by Persons claiming the Bounties for supplying the City of Dublin with Corn and Flour.

And to One Private Bill.

Dresden, May 13. Last Sunday, being her Highness the Electress of Saxony's Birth-day, was observed here with the usual Ceremonies. At Noon the Foreign Ministers presented their Congratulations, as did likewise the different Corps in Civil and Military Employments, each Corps being admitted separately. The Electoral Family dined all together; and in the Evening the Court appeared at the Apartments in Gala. The next Day their Electoral Highnesses went to Pillnitz, about Six Miles from hence, with an Intention to reside there during the Summer.
