Stockholm, May 5.

THE States have been only once assembled in Pleno this last Week, when the Three Lower Orders resolved that Three old Senators, Lagerbielke, Hermelin, and Gyllenstierna, should be desired to resume their Places in the Senate, notwithstanding the Excuses they had made at the Beginning of the Diet.

In the House of Nobles it was resolved, that the Electors of the new Senators should be ready for the next Plenum, which will be held To-morrow, but it is not yet known whether any Presentation can be made, because the King is to go out of Town to Eckholmsund. This will depend upon the Time his Majesty is pleased to set out.

Yesterday Baron Duben, the new President of the Chancery, notified to the Foreign Ministers, that they might for the Future address themselves to him, and Count Ulric Scheffer took his Leave of the Chancery.

The Committee of Expedition was assembled this Morning, to put the last Hand to the Deposition of the Senators; so there are now only Nine remaining, Counts Horn, Kalling, Walwick, Sinclair; Barons Reuterholm, Funch, and Ribbing, who are here, Count Schwerin who is at Berlin, and General Lieven, who is in Pomerania.

Gloucester-House, May 24.

This Day the Count de Pignatelli, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of the Two Sicilies; and the Baron de Bertendis, Resident from Venice, had Private Audiences of his Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester.

To which they were introduced by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.
