Jerfey, or any Part thereof, shall be aired at a cer-tain Place on the Coast of the said Island, called Belle Croute, or at such Place herein before appointed, for Performance of 'Quarantine on the Coaft of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are imported, ifall refpectively perform their Quarantine : And all fuch Goods as fhall be im-ported to the Islands of Guernsey, Sark, or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them or any of them, shall be aired in a Place near the Island of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quaran-tine on the Coaft of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are imported, fhall respectively perform their Quarantine.

That whatfoever Ship or Perfon shall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Ship or Veffel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That fuch Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, shall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Veffel, for the Taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection, from the Goods and Merchandizes before enumerated, shall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine.

That the Captains of every of His Majesty's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain or Ireland, or of the liles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, shall take due Carë to prevent the Landing any Goods, Seamen, or Passengers, from on Board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Cuftoms.

That the Commissioners and other Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majefty's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majesty's Forts and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coafts, and all the Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Constables, Headboroughs, Tythingmen, and all other Officers and Ministers of Juffice, be aiding and affifting to the faid Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms, and to all others that shall be concerned in stopping all such Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant-General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necelfary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Stockbolm, June 23. The King fet out last Saturday for Eckholmfund, in order to go from thence Yesterday to the Waters of Lohka, where it is faid his Majesty proposes to use the Cold Bath for eight Days, and to return hither the Beginning of next Month.

The Installation of the Commanders and Knights of the new Order of Vafa is fixed for the 17th of

July. Last Week his Majesty and the two Princes, having affembled a Number of Officers, exercised them in the Park near Stockholm, when they performed feveral Manœuvres, in one of which Mr. Stierncrona, an Officer of the Guards, fell with his Horfe against a Stump of a Tree, and fractured his Scull, and is fince dead : Some other Officers

were hurt, but not dangeroufly. The Committees of the Dyet continue their Affemblies every Day; but the Plena will not meet till the Plan of Finances is ready to be produced.
