PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act of Parliament paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An "Act to oblige Ships more effectually

" to perform their Quarantine; and for the better " Preventing the Plague being brought from Fo-" reign Parts into Great Britain or Ireland, or the " Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark, or " Man," It is among many other Things Enacted, That all Ships and Veffels arriving, and all Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain or Ireland, or any of the Isles aforementioned, from any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs, or Succeffors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy-Council, shall judge it probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in fuch Place and Places, for fuch Time, and in fuch Manner, as has been, or shall, from Time to Time, be directed by His Majefty, His Heirs, or Succeffors, by His or Their Order or Orders made in His or Their Privy-Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Gocds, and Mer-chandizes, fhall have refpectively performed, and be difcharged from, fuch Quarantine, no fuch Per-fon, Goods, or Merchandizes, or any of them, fhall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on Board any other Ship or Vessel, in any Place within His Majesty's Dominions, unless in Place within Fils Wajery's Dominions, unleis in fuch Manner, and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Li-cence as fhall be directed or permitted by fuch Or-der or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs, or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid ; and that all fuch Succentors, in Council as aforeiand; and that an inch Ships and Veffels, and the Perfons or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on Board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats, and Per-fons, receiving any Goods or Perfons out of the fame, fhall be fubject to fuch Orders, Rules, and Directions concerning Quarantine, and the Preven-tion of Infection, as have been or fhall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs, and Succeffors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned, under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid A&

And whereas upon Information received of the Plague breaking out in divers Parts, feveral Orders have been heretofore made by His Majefty at this Board, requiring Quarantine to be performed by all Ships and Veficls coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the Weft Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or from Archangel, Peterfburgh, Narva, Riga, or any other Port or Place in the Dominions of Ruffia; and alfo by all Ships and Veficls whatfoever having Cotton-Weol on Board, (except Ships and Veficls from America, or the Weft Indies, with that Commodity on Board, the Produce of thofe Parts.)

And whereas notwithftanding it appears by the Accounts received from His Majefty's Minifters Abroad, that the Sickness, which raged last Year at Moscow, and in other Parts of the Dominions of Ruffia, has very much fubfided during the Winter; yet, as the fame may be liable to break out again, and is more apt to rage in the Summer-Months, it is Matter of the higheft Importance, that every Precaution fhould be obferved ; and His Majesty doth still judge it probable, that the Infection may be brought into this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from Archangel, Peterfburgh, Narva, Riga, or fome other Port or Place in the Dominions of Ruffia; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, now arrived, or that fhall hereafter ar-rive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from or through the Mediterranean, or from the Weft Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or from Archangel, Peterfburgh, Narva, Riga, or from any other Port or Place in the Dominions of Ruffia, do make their Quarantaine for Forty Days, which is to com-mence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Veffel shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for performing Quarantine, and not be-

That all Ships and Veffels whatfoever, having Cotton-Wool on Board, (except Ships and Veffels from America, or the Weft Indies, with that Commodity on Board, the Produce of those Parts) now arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, which is to commence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Vessel shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for performing Quarantine, and not before.

That the Places herein after named, fhall be, and are hereby appointed to be, the Places, wherein fuch Ships or Veffels (not having the Infection on Board) fhall refpectively perform Quarantine, that is to fay, all fuch Ships or Veffels, which are or fhall be bound to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames or Medway, fhall perform their Quarantine in Standgate Creek : All fuch Ships or Veffels, which are or fhall be bound to the Ports of Ipfwich, Yarmouth, Bofton, Hull, Newcaftle, or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, fhall perform their Quarantine in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimfby : All fuch Ships or Veffels, which are or fhall be bound to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Ifle of Man, fhall perform their Quarantine in a Place called Highlake near Liverpoole, at the Weft End thereof : All fuch Ships or Veffels, which are or fhall be bound to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucefter, Briftol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padftow or St. Ives, being

being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfratomb or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol or Bridgwater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall perform their Quarantine in King-road and Porshute Pill : All fuch Ships or Vessels, which are or shall be bound to the Port of Plymouth, except such Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and alfo except Falmouth one Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks, or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exèter, and Pool, except as before excepted, shall perform their Quarantine in some Place betwe n Wood End and Saltash in the River Tamer : All fuch Ships or Veffels, as are or fhail be bound to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called St Ives Pobl, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth : And all fuch Ships or Veffels, as are. or shall be bound to the Ports of Southampton, Chichester, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, shall perform their Quarantine at a Place called the Mother Bank near Portimouth : And all fuch Ships or Veffels, as are or shall be bound to the Eastern-Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstones, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anstruther, Preftonpans, Dundee. Perth, Montrofe, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Inverkeithing Bay: And all fuch Ships or Veffels. as are or shall be bound to the Western Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Lamlath in the Island of Arran : And all such Ships or Veffels, as are or shall be bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Inverness, Zetland, Orkney, Caithness, and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Firth : And all fuch Ships or Veffels, as are or shall be bound to the South-Weft Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Durafries and Kirkuedbright, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof fhall perform their Quarantine at Carsthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith : And all fuch Ships or Veffels, which are or shall be bound to the Isle of Jersey, or any Port thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at a certain Place, on the Coast of the faid Island, called Belle Croute, or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England : And all fuch Ships or Veffels, as fhall be bound to the Islands of Guernfey, Sark, or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place near the Island of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England. That no Pilot shall go on Board any Ship or Vef-

That no Pilot shall go on Board any Ship or Veffel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the fame into any Port or Place, but shall perform such Service in some other Boat or Veffel, which Boat or Veffel shall keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Veffel so to be conducted as peffible; and if any Pilot or other Person shall go on Board such Ship or Veffel, such Pilot or other Person shall perform Quarantine, in like Manner as any Person coming in such Ship or Vessel shall be obliged to perform the fame.

That ail Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes, liable Quarantine as aforefaid, shall be opened, unpacked, and aired, unless His Majesty shall think

fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwile, and fo reinain a Week; other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk raw, thrown, or wrought, Linen, Cotton-Wool, Cotton Yarn or manufactured Wool raw, or anywile Wrought, Feathers, Grograin or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats Hairr Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins and Skins in the Wool of Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats and Brufhes, Matting, and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes, fo as aforefaid enumerated, are to be opened, unpacked, and aired, unlefs His Majefty thall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherways, and fo remain for the Space of a Fortnight.

That all Goods imported by fuch Ships and Vef-, fels refpectively, fhall be aired in the following Places, that is to fay, All fuch Goods as fhall be imported to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames or Medway, fhall be aired in Standgate Creek : All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Ipfwich, Yarmouth, Boflon, Huli, Newcafile, or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, shall be aired in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimfby: All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Isle of Man, shall be aired in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpoole, at the West End thereof: All such Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucetter, Brittol, Bridgwater, or any of. them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Pauftow or St. lves, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracomb or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, or Bridgwater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall be aired in Kingroad and Porshute Pill : All such Goods as shall be imported to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts. thereof as have been herein before-mentioned, and. alfo except Falmouth, one Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members, or Creeks, or other Places, within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter, and Pool, except as before excepted, fhall be aired in fome Place between Wood-End and Saltafh, in the River Tamer: All fuch Goods as shall be imported to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall be aired in a Place called St. Ives Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth: All fuch Goods as fhall be imported to the Ports of Southampton, Chichefter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or any of them, or any other Place within the fame, shall be aired at a Place called the Mother-Bank, near Portfmouth : And all fuch Goods as shall be imported. to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstoness, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anstruther, Prestonpans, Dundee, Perth, Montrofe, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired in Inverkeithing Bay : And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Western Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothlay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired. at Lamlash, in the Island of Arran : And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Invernefs; Zetland, Orkney, Caithness, and Stormaway, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof; shall. be aired in Cromarty Bay, in the Murray Firth : And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the South-.

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West Ports of Scotland, comptehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkuedbright, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall be aired at Carsthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith : And all such Goods as shall be imported to the Isle of Jerfey, or any Part thereof, shall be aired at a certain Place on the Coast of the faid Island, called Belle Croute, or at such Place herein before appointed, for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are imported, shall respectively perform their Quarantine: And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Islands of Guernfey, Sark, or Alder-ney, or either of them, or any Part of them or any of them, shall be aired in a Place near the Island of Guernfey, called the Little Roal, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coast of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are imported, shall respectively perform their Quarantine.

That whatloever Ship or Perfon shall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Ship or Vessel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That fuch Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, fhall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Veffel, for the Taking any Goods not liable to retain Intection, from the Goods and Merchandizes before enumerated, shall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine.

That the Captains of every of His Majefty's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain or Leland, or of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, shall take due Care to prevent the Landing any Goods, Seamen, or Paffengers, from on Board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Customs.

That the Commissioners and other Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majefty's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majefty's Forts and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coafts, and all the Justices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Constables, Headboroughs, Tythingmen, and all other Officers and Ministers of Justice, be aiding and affisting to the faid Officers of His Majefty's Cuffoms, and to all others that shall be concerned in stopping all such Ships as aforetaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Lieutenant-General and the reft of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Sccretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

St. James's, July 18, 1772. Whereas it has been humbly reprefenied to the King, That on Tuesday the 26th Day of May last, the Prince Erneft Shallop, Michael Cock late Master, in the Serwice of His Majefty's Castoms at the Port of St. Iwes, being on a Cruize off the Land's End, faw at an Anchor off a Cove called Porth Gwarra, in the Parish of St. Lewan in the County of Cornwall, about two Miles from the Shore, a large Smugling Veffel, about One Hundred Tons Burthen, with one Mast, Cutter rigged, an upright Stern, without a Counter, a great Rake in her Stern, deep waisted, a short Mast-head with a Vane upon it painted Black, her Sails White, with three new Pieces about ten or twelve Feet long each, in the Weather of her Main Sail about Half euco, in the vector of per triain Sais about Half-Way up, and one whole new Cloth in the Lee of the fame Sail, had about Thirty Men on Board, and a Six-oar'd Boat; which Veffel, as foon as the Prince Ernest appeared, made Sail towards her, and, when the came within Pistol-shot, began firing upon her with Eight Carriage Guns, and also with Savivels loaded with Grape-shot, and Balls about Four or Six Pounds Weight, and with Mulkets, which was con-tinued very bot for Half an Hour, when the Muster of the Prince Ernest, baving no Great Guns or Swivels to make any Refistance, ran the Shallop as near as be

poffibly could to the Shore, without stranding her, and there brought her to an Anchor, and then he and his Crew took to their Boat, and got on Shore; during which, the faid Veffel continued firing Great Guns and Small Arms at them; and about an Hour after they bad got on Shore, the Boat, belonging to the aforefaid Veffel, with Ten Men in her, went along Side the Prince Erneft Shallop, cut her Cable, and let her drive, the Veffel still continuing her Fire at the Shal-lop's People on Shore; and after the Prince Erness had drove out about a Quarter of a Mile, the was boarded by the People belonging to the Smugling Veffel, who boifted her Giufail, gan her off about a League from the Shore, and after plundering ber, it is supposed they scuttled her, as the was feen to fink about Seven o'Clock in the Evening of the faid Day : - His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Perfons concerned in the faid Offence, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracicus Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, fo that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
