Dresden, July 15.

ON Sunday last Prince Xavier, the Elector of Saxony's eldest Uncle, returned to this City, after an Absence of three Years. His Royal Highness's Arrival was attended with all the Honours that could be paid him on that Occasion. His Brother the Duke of Courland, and several Officers of the Garrison, went to meet his Royal Highness on the Road, and the next Day he was received at Pilsnitz by all the Electoral Family. Yesterday the Foreign Ministers waited on his Royal Highness; and he also received the Officers of the Garrison, and the Nobility of the Town.

Berlin, July 18. Her Majesty the Queen Dowager of Sweden returned from Sans Souci on Monday last; as did also the Princes and Princesses, who accompanied her on this Visit to his Prussian Majesty.

Hague, July 24. Yesterday arrived here a Courier from Kirchheim-Bohland in the County of Nassau, with the agreeable News that the Princess of Weilburg was safely delivered of a Son, on the 19th Instant; and that her Serene Highness and the young Prince are both as well as can be expected.

Public Annuitant Society, July 6, 1772.

At a very numerous General Meeting held at the Queen's Arms Tavern, St. Paul's Church-Yard, the Directors reported, that they were unanimously of Opinion, from inspecting the State of the Society, and from Calculations they had ordered to be made, that the Payments of the Members were every way inadequate to the Terms proposed, and that the Fund of the Society would be very insufficient to pay the Annuities promised by the Proposals; therefore they recommended to the General Meeting, that the Society be dissolved, and the Money already paid, returned; and that a Committee be appointed by the General Meeting for that Purpose. That the Thanks of the General Court be given to the Directors for their candid Report of the State of the Society, this Day read; and also for their particular Care and Attention to the Property of the Members belonging to the same.

And, That the Committee be requested to publish these Resolutions in the Daily Papers.
