The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty in Council, that in the late Order of the 8th of this Instant, in the Appointment of the Places for the Performance of Quarantine by Ships and Vessels bound to the several Ports of this Kingdom, the Port of Lynn is not mentioned;—His Majesty is therefore pleased, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, to Order, as it is hereby Ordered, that all such Ships or Vessels, as are or shall be bound to the Port of Lynn, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, from any Place or Places from whence Quarantine is required to be performed, shall perform their Quarantine in Whitebooth Road between Hull and Grimsby; and that all Goods, imported on Board such Ships, shall be aired at the same Place: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and all others whom it may concern, are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

St. James's, August 1, 1772.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, on Tuesday Night the 7th of July last past, the Grounds of John Stuckey, Esq; at Branscombe in the County of Devon, were feloniously entered, and Seventy-four Sheep stolen thereout, having their Wool unshorn, and marked as follows, viz. Eighteen Ewes of different Ages, some of them marked on the near and others on the further Side, with the Letter S in a Circle; Sixteen Ewe-hogs marked S on the further Side; Six Wether-hogs marked S on the near Side; All which said Ewe-hogs and Wether-hogs had likewise an old Mark of Red Ochre over their Shoulders and Loins: Also Thirty-four Lambs marked S on the near Side: And likewise, that there were several French Fishing Boats, and a small Vessel from the Westward, seen hovering near the Sea-shore, at the Time the said Felony was committed; and that, from many concurrent Circumstances, there is great Reason to suspect, that the said Sheep were put on board the said Boats, or Vessel, and landed on the French Coast, about Lower Normandy or Bretagne, and soon afterwards sold: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Felony, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement, the said John Stuckey doth hereby promise (over and above the Reward allowed by Act of Parliament) a Reward of TEN GUINEAS to any Person or Persons who shall discover his or their Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof; to be paid immediately upon such Conviction.
