Petersbourg, July 14.
ON Thursday last, being the Anniversary of the Empress's Accession to the Throne, there was a splendid Court at Peterhoff, one of her Imperial Majesty's Summer Palaces, about Twenty Miles from Petersbourg; and the Evening of Friday, the Grand Duke's Name-Day, was celebrated by a most magnificent Masked Ball, which his Imperial Majesty honoured by dancing several Dances. Preparations of great Taste and Expence were made for illuminating the Gardens and Environs, which are very extensive, in the most beautiful Manner; but unfortunately the Rain prevented their Exhibition. The Company in the Apartments was very numerous, and the Dresses of the Nobility and Gentry were very rich and elegant. Besides the Tables for the Court and the Foreign Ministers, an elegant cold Supper was served for the rest of the Assembly; and the Dances continued till late in the next Morning with the greatest Order.

Her Imperial Majesty and the Grand Duke are expected to return to Zarco Zelo, towards the Beginning of next Week, for the Remainder of the Summer.

Berlin, August 1. Yesterday there was Court in the Queen Dowager of Sweden's Apartments, when the Foreign Ministers and others took Leave of her Majesty and the Princess. Monday his Prussian Majesty is expected here, and Tuesday the Queen of Sweden leaves this Place: She is to be accompanied by the Princes Ferdinand and Henry as far as the Second Day's Journey.

Hague, August 7. This Day her Royal Highness enters into her Twenty-second Year; on which Occasion there is a Dinner at Court, and a Ball and Supper at Prince Lewis of Brunswick's.
