**H**IS Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable William Earl of Dartmouth to be one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, his Lordship was this Day, by His Majesty's Command, sworn one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.

*St. James's, August 12.*

The King has been pleased to grant unto the Right Honourable Allen Lord Bathurst, and his Issue Male, the Dignity of an Earl of the Kingdom of Great Britain, by the Name, Style, and Title of Earl Bathurst, of Bathurst in the County of Kent.

The King also has been pleased to grant unto the Right Honourable Wills Hill Earl of Hillsborough in the Kingdom of Ireland, and Lord Harwich Baron of Harwich in the County of Essex, and to his Issue Male, the Dignities of Viscount and Earl of Great Britain, by the Names, Style, and Titles of Viscount Fairford, and Earl of Hillsborough in the County of Gloucester.

*Stockholm, July 28.* Last Sunday Evening His Swedish Majesty came to Town from Eckholm-fund.

Reports having been made to the Government, that great Dissatisfaction is perceived in several Provinces on Account of the Scarcity and Dearness of Corn, General Duriez has been sent to Wermeland, Major-General Blixen to Dalecarlia, and Colonel Sprengport to Finland, in order to prevent any Disturbances, and to enquire into the Distribution of the Corn sent by the Crown for the Relief of those Provinces.

The Senate has appointed Count Dohna, Colonel of the Regiment of Cavalry of South Schonen, to be Captain-Lieutenant of the Drabants, which gives the Rank of Major-General.
