**T**HE Empress came to Town on Wednesday last; and Yesterday, being the Feast of St. Alexander Newsky, the Empress, attended by the Knights of that Order and the rest of the Court, and preceded by a great Number of the Clergy, walked in Procession from the Casan Church to the Monastery of St. Alexander, on a Platform erected for the Occasion; after her Return, the Knights had the Honour of Dining with her Imperial Majesty, and in the Evening there was a Ball.

*Stockholm, September 18.* Major General Pechlin is still in Arrest at Gripsholm.

Last Sunday Morning Mr. De Lafey, late Spanish Minister to this Court, set out from hence for Peterburg, whither he was to have gone last Spring, but received an Order to remain here till the Conclusion of the Dyet.

Yesterday the King came to Town to be present at the Oath taken to the new Form of Government, by the Troops lately arrived from Finland. They were drawn up on the Northern Market, and commanded by Lieutenant-General Sprengport: After they had taken the Oath, they fired several Salvos of Cannon and Musquetry, which were answered by the Cannon of the Ships in the Harbour which brought them over; as soon as this was over, the King returned directly to Eckeholmsund, without going up to the Palace:

General Ehrenwerd is made Velt Marshal, in the Room of Senator Fersen, and is succeeded as General of Infantry by Lieutenant-General Stierfeld.
