*St. James's, October 25.*

**T**HIS Day being the Anniversary of the King's Accession to the Throne, who entered into the Thirteenth Year of His Reign, the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired; and in the Evening there were Illuminations, and other Publick Demonstrations of Joy, in London and Westminster.

*Peterburg, October 2.* Yesterday the Grand Duke, having attained the Age of Eighteen, became Major as Duke of Holstein; upon which Occasion the Empress and his Imperial Highness received the Compliments of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction.

*Peterburg, October 8.* By all the Intelligence from Moscow, and other Parts of the Empire, they continue, notwithstanding the great Rains and warm Weather for near a Month past, in the same good State of Health as before the Plague appeared, and are not under the least Apprehensions of it's breaking out a second Time, the same Orders and Regulations to prevent it being still continued by the Government.

*Stockholm, October 12.* Last Tuesday the King ordered the Regiment of Guards to assemble in the Park, when his Majesty was pleased in Person to present Lieutenant General Sprengporten to them as their new Colonel, in the room of Field Marshal Ferfen: At the same Time his Majesty declared, that he erected the Regiment of Dragoons of Lieutenant-General Sprengporten into a Corps of Horse Guards, in which Quality they were to serve for the future.

*Vienna, October 14.* Prince Gallitzin, the Russian Minister at this Court, has received, by a Courier from Peterburg, the Ensigns of the Order of St. Andrew, with which the Empress of Russia, his Sovereign, has been pleased to honour him.

On Sunday last his Imperial Majesty was pleased to give, with the Ceremonies usual on the Occasion, the Collar of the Order of the Golden Fleece unto Count Gundacre de Colloredo, Privy Councillor and Commissary Plenipotentiary at the Visitation of the Imperial Chamber of Wetzlar.

His Imperial Majesty also the same Day created Prince Joseph de Lobkowitz, (their Imperial Majesties Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of Peterburg, Chamberlain, Lieutenant-General, and Knight of the Military Order of Maria-Theresa,) a Knight of the said Order of the Golden Fleece.
