BY Accounts of undoubted Authority received from Scotland it appears, that the Report of the Plague's having made its Appearance at Lewis, one of the Western Islands, was not founded in Truth; a putrid Fever, which had prevailed for two or three Months in that Island, gave Rise to the Alarm: And the several Accounts which have been lately published, stating the Infection as imported by Goods landed from a Vessel from Dantzic at the island of Lewis, are equally void of Foundation, as, by the last Accounts received from Dantzic, it does not appear that there has lately been the least Symptom of any infectious Distemper in that City.

NO accurate Accounts have yet been received of the Damage done by the Hurricane in the Leeward Islands: It appears in general that the Loss sustained at St. Domingo and Antigua has been very considerable; but we have the Pleasure to learn, that, though the Hurricane was severe on the North Side of Jamaica, no Mischief of any Consequence ensued there.

Dublin, November 7.

Wednesday last, being the Anniversary of the Birth of the late King William the Third of glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower; at Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; after which his Excellency, attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, went in Procession round the Statue of King William, the Regiments on Dublin Duty lined the Statue on each Side; and, after his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up on College-Green; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy. And the following Day, being the Anniversary of the horrid Gunpowder Plot, the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Round, and answered by Volleys of Small Arms from the Regiments of Foot on Duty, drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks, and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that, on the 31st past, Thomas Osling, Woodward to the Marquess of Rockingham, on his Return from Doncaster in the County of York, between the Hours of Nine and Ten in the Evening, then on Horseback, with his Wife riding behind him, was stoppt opposite the Pond, at the Top of Saint Pancher'sgate, by Two Men on Foot, who came out of a Lane near the said Place, and who presented a Pistol at him, and demanded his Money, which he repeatedly refusing to deliver, one of them fired the Pistol and killed him on the Spot. The above Two Men appeared to be dressed in dark or blue coloured Cloaths; one of them a slender Man, the other a broad-set Man, not tall: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Perpetrator of so wicked and inhuman a Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Person concerned therein, (except the Person who actually fired the said Pistol) who shall discover his Accomplice who fired the said Pistol, so that he may be apprehended and convicted of the said Murder.
