Accounts of undoubted Authority received from Scotland it appears, that the Report of the Plague's having made its Appearance at Lewis, one of the Western Islands, was not founded in Truth; a putrid Fever, which had prevailed for two or three Months in that Island, gave Rise to the Alarm: And the feveral Accounts which have been lately published, stating the Infection as imported by Goods landed from a Vessel from Dantzig at the island of Lewis, are equally void of Foundation, as, by the last Accounts received from Dantzig, it does not appear that there has lately been the least Symptom of any infectious Distemper in that City.

O accurate Accounts have yet been received of the Damage done by the Hurricane in the Leeward Islands: It appears in general that the Loss sustained at St. Domingo and Antigua has been very considerable; but we have the Pleasure to learn, that, though the Hurricane was severe on the North Side of Jamaica, no Mischief of any Confequence enfued there.

Wednesday last, being the Anniversary of the Birth of the late King William the Third of glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower; at Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; after which his Excellency, attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, went in Procession round the Statue of King William, the Regiments on Dublin Duty lined the Statue on each Side; and, after his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phonix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up on College-Green; and the Night con-cluded with Bonfires; Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy. And the following Day, being the Anniversary of the horrid Gunpowder Plot, the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phænix were fired three Round, and answered by Volites of Small Arms from the Regiments of Foot on Duty, drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks, and at Night there were Sonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
