His Majesty has been pleased to appoint Major-General Charles Fitzroy, of the 14th Regiment of Dragoons, to be Colonel of the 3d or King's own Regiment of Dragoons, in the room of the Earl of Albemarle, deceased.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint Lieutenant-General Bigoe Armstrong, of the Royal American Regiment, to be Colonel of the 8th or the King's Regiment of Foot, in the room of Lieutenant-General Daniel Webb, promoted to the Command of the 14th Regiment of Dragoons.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint Major-General Frederick Haldimand to be Colonel-Commandant of a Battalion in the Royal American Regiment, in the room of Lieutenant-General Armstrong.

*Dublin, November 7.*

Wednesday last, being the Anniversary of the Birth of the late King William the Third of glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower; at Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; after which his Excellency, attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, went in Procession round the Statue of King William, the Regiments on Dublin Duty lined the Statue on each Side; and, after his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up on College-Green; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy. And the following Day, being the Anniversary of the horrid Gunpowder Plot, the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Round, and answered by Volleys of Small Arms from the Regiments of Foot on Duty, drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks, and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

*St. James's, November 14.*

*Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that, on the 31st past, Thomas Ojling, Woodward to the Marquess of Rockingham, on his Return from Doncaster in the County of York, between the Hours of Nine and Ten in the Evening, then on Horseback, with his Wife riding behind him, was stop'd opposite the Pond, at the Top of Saint Puchersgate, by Two Men on Foot, who came out of a Lan near the said Place, and who presented a Pistol at him, and demanded his Money, which he repeatedly refusing to deliver, one of them fired the Pistol and killed him on the Spot. The above Two Men appeared to be dressed in dark or blue coloured Cloaths; one of them a slender Man, the other a broad-set Man, not tall: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Perpetrator of so wicked and inhuman a Murder, is hereby pleased to promise his most gracious Pardon to any Person concerned therein, (except the Person who actually fired the said Pistol) who shall discover his Accomplice who fired the said Pistol, so that he may be apprehended and convicted of the said Murder.*
