The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day the Right Honourable Sir Thomas Parker, Knight, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

St. James's, November 21.

The King has been pleased to appoint Edward Bayntun, Esq; to be His Majesty's Consul General at Tripoli, in the room of Edward Barker, Esq; deceased.

St. James's, November 14, 1772.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that, on the 21st past, Thomas Osling, Woodward to the Marquess of Rockingham, on his Return from Doncaster in the County of York, between the Hours of Nine and Ten in the Evening, then on Horseback, with his Wife riding behind him, was stopp'd opposite the Pond, at the Top of Saint Pulchersgate, by Two Men on Foot, who came out of a Lane near the said Place, and who presented a Pistol at him, and demanded his Money, which he repeatedly refusing to deliver, one of them fired the Pistol and killed him on the Spot. The above Two Men appeared to be dressed in dark or blue coloured Cloaths; one of them a slender Man, the other a broad-set Man, not tall: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Perpetrator of so wicked and inhuman a Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Person concerned therein, (except the Person who actually fired the said Pistol) who shall discover his Accomplice who fired the said Pistol, so that he may be apprehended and convicted of the said Murder.

And, as a farther Encouragement, the Marquess of Rockingham does hereby promise a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS to any Person or Persons (excepting those concerned in the said Murder) who shall be the Means of discovering and bringing to Justice the actual Perpetrator thereof; to be paid on Conviction.
