H A R C O U R T,

WHEREAS His Majesty hath signified unto Us His Royal Pleasure, That the Parliament of this Kingdom, which now stands prorogued to Tuesday the Eighth Day of this Instant December, be further prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-sixth Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-three; We do therefore publish and declare, That the said Parliament be, and accordingly the said Parliament is hereby further prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-sixth Day of January, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-three: Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament, are to take Notice accordingly. Given at His Majesty's Castle of Dublin, the Second Day of December, 1772.

Constantinople, November 3. On the 24th past the Plenipotentiary Abdurrezak, Reis Effendi, set out from the Vizir's Camp at Schumlat, for the Congress to be holden at Bucharest, accompanied by the several Councillors, Secretaries, and Druggomen of his Mission, together with his Nephew, and some of the principal Officers of the Janizaries.

St. James's, December 12.
