THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to prohibit the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Pease, Beans, Meal, Malt, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, and Starch; and also the Extraction of Low Wines and Spirits from Wheat and Wheat Flour, for a limited Time.

An Act to continue for a further Time, an Act made in the Eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act to continue and amend an Act made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, for a limited Time; and for allowing the Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from the British Dominions in America, for a limited Time.

An Act to continue for a further Time, an Act made in the Seventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act to discontinue, for a limited Time, the Duties payable upon the Importation of Tallow, Hogs Lard, and Grease; and to permit the Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, Hams, and Cheese, into this Kingdom, from any Part of Europe, for a limited Time, free of Duty.

Dublin-Caple, December 8.

This Morning Lord Viscount Townshend, late Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom, embarked on Board His Majesty's Yatch the Dorset, on his Return to England.

His Excellency the Earl Harcourt and Lord Townshend went together from the Castle in a Chariot drawn by Six Horses, and preceded by a leading Coach and Six, in which were the Officers of State, to the Pidgeon Houe, where Lord Townshend embarked on Board the Revenue Barge for the Yacht, which lay in the Bay: — They were escorted by a Squadron of Horse, and attended by several of the Nobility and Gentry in their Carriages, followed by a great Con-

course of People, to the Water-side: The Streets were lined by the Regiments of Infantry upon Dublin Duty: The Procession was grand, and conducted with the utmost Propriety and Order; and in his Passage through the Streets, Lord Townshend receivd every Demonstration of Respect from the People, who testified their Regard for him by their repeated Acclamations, and Wishes for his Welfare and Prosperity, and safe Return to England.

Several Barges, filled with Gentlemen of Distinction, attended Lord Townshend from the Pidgeon House to the Yatch, which immediately set sail with a fair Wind for Parkgate.
