A: A.7 to probibit the Exportation of Corn, Grain, Pease, Beans, Meal, Malt, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, and Starch; and also the Extraction of Low Wines and Spirits from Wheat and Wheat Flour, for a limited Time.

An Act to continue for a further Time, an Act made in the Eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, in-tituled, An Act to continue and amend an Act made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, for a limited Time; and for allowing the Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacen, and Butter, from the British Dominions in America, for a limited Time.

course of People, to the Water-fide: The Streets were lined by the Regiments of Infantry upon Dublin Duty: The Procession was grand, and conducted with the utmost Propriety and Order; and in his Passage through the Streets, Lord Townshend receive every-Demonstration of Respeck from the People, who testified their Regard for him by their repeated Acclamations, and Wishes for his Welfare and Prosperity, and safe Return to England.

Several Barges, filled with Gentlemen of Dif-tinction, attended Lord Townshend from the Pidgeon House to the Yatch, which immediately set fail with a fair Wind for Parkgate.
