**H**IS Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Robert Lord Clive to be Lord Lieutenant of the Counties of Salop and Montgomery, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

This Day George Chetwynd, Esq; was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn one of the Clerks of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council in Ordinary.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Leonard Thompson, Esq; the Office of Master or Register and the taking Cognizance of the Free Contents of such Persons as shall voluntarily go or be sent as Servants to any of His Majesty's Plantations in America or elsewhere.

*Vienna, November 29.* Accounts have been received here that the Congress was opened at Bucharetz on the 9th Instant.

*Berlin, December 5.* On Saturday last, the 28th of November, the Infant, of which Her Royal Highness Princess Ferdinand was lately delivered, was baptized at the Country Palace of Frederichsfeldt. The Sponsors were, His Prussian Majesty, the Prince of Orange, and the Margrave of Schwedt. The Infant was named Frederick William. His Prussian Majesty stood in Person, and after dining that Day at Frederichsfeldt returned to Sans Souci.

with a great Number of Horses loaded with Bags of Tea and a small Quantity of Liquor; which endeavouring to seize, they were immediately surrounded by the Smugglers, who attacked them with large Clubs and loaded Whips so violently, that the Officers were obliged to retreat with only with only two Casks of Brandy and Geneva, at the utmost Hazard of their Lives, Mr. Holloway having been knocked from his Horse, and rendered quite senseless by two dangerous Wounds on each Side of his Head.

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the Offenders to Justice, do hereby promise a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS to any Person who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any one or more of the said Offenders, to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Customs upon Conviction.

And if any of the said Offenders shall, within Three Months from the Date hereof, discover his Accomplices, so that two of them at least be apprehended and convicted, the Offender making such Discovery shall be entitled to the like Reward, and be discharged of such his Offence.
