A P R O C L A M A T I O N,
For Encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War.

G E O R G E R.

WHEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all such Seamen, and Landmen, who shall voluntarily enter themselves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation: And We do hereby promise and declare, That all such Able Seamen, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Thirty-first Day of May next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or such Officers as shall be employed for raising Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Three Pounds each Man; and all such Ordinary Seamen, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves, as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Two Pounds each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; and all such Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five Years, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fit for Our Service, who shall so enter themselves, as aforesaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; such respective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, residing at the Ports or Places where the Ships into which they shall be entered shall be, immediately after such Men shall have been Three Times mustered: And We do declare, That the Qualifications of the several Men so entering themselves, as aforesaid, shall be certified by the Captain, Master, and Boatswain, of the said Ship or Vessel where they shall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abuses by any Persons leaving the Vessels to which they shall belong, and entering themselves on board any other Our Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the said Bounty Money; We do hereby Declare and Command, That such Seamen, or Landmen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Vessels, as shall absent themselves from any of the said Ships or Vessels to which they shall belong, and shall enter themselves on board any other of Our said Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the said Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shall leave, but also be severely punished according to their Demerits.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's*, the Twenty-second Day of *April*, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-three, and in the Thirtieth Year of Our Reign.

The Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for paying Half Pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st Day of July to the 31st of December, 1772, according to His Majesty's Establishment in that Behalf; These are to give Notice, that the said Payments will begin to be made at the Office of the Treasurer of the Navy in Broad-Street, on Monday and Tuesday the 10th and 11th of next Month, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, viz. To Captains and their Attorneys, and other Officers appearing themselves, on the Monday; and to Attorneys of Lieutenants, Masters and Surgeons, on the Tuesday, (after which the Lists will be recalled once a Month) that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable unto them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Publick Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay; but also produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oath required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in Case any of the said Sea Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Attorneys for that Purpose, that the said Attorneys may produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.
