## St. James's, June 29, 1773.

ARLY in the Morning on Tuesday the 22d Instant, the King set out from Kew for Portsmouth; and being arrived at Portfea Bridge between Ten and Eleven the fame Morning, was received by a Royal Salute of Twenty-one Guns. His Majefty then proceeded to the First Barrier, where Major General Parker, who commanded the Garrison during the Royal Residence at Portsmouth, delivered the Keys of the Garrison to the King, who was pleased to return them. On His Majefty's entering the Land Port-Gate, he was faluted by a triple Discharge of 232 Pieces of Cannon mounted on the Ramparts of Portsmouth, at Blockhouse Fort, and at South-Sea Castle.

His Majefty proceeded through the Town out at the Water-Gate to the Dock-Yard, and arrived at the Commiffioner's Houfe ten Minutes before Eleven o'Clock, where He was received by the Prefident of His Majefty's moft Honourable Privy-Council, the Lord Privy Seal, the Lord Chamberlain of His Majefty's Houfehold, the Firft Lord Commiffioner of the 'Treafury, the Secretaries of State, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, the Treafurer and Commiffioners of the Navy, the Three Admirals of the Squadron at Spithead, and the Mafter and Lieutenant-General of the Ordnance. The Artificers and Workmen belonging to the Yard, being all affembled before the Houfe, gave Three Cheers as His Majefty entered, and then immediately difperfed, and returned to their feveral Employments.

After His Majefty had taken fome Refreihment, He went to the Governor's Houfe in the Town, attended by the Nobility and Perfons of Difinction, and had a Publick Levee, at which a great Number of the Officers of the Navy and Army were prefent, as also many Gentlemen of the Country, who on this Occasion came in to pay their Duty to His Majefty.

The Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen and Burgeffes of the Town waited on his Majefty, and prefented the following Addrefs.

To-the King's most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

W E the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen and

Burgeffes of the Town of Portfmouth, humbly beg Leave to pay our Duty to your Majefty, and to congratulate your Majefty upon your Arrival in this Town.

Nothing can give us greater Joy and Satiffaction, than to fee your Majefty fhewing fo much Attention, and doing fo much Honor, to the Glory and Bulwark of these Kingdoms. We defire to express the warmess Affection for your Majefty's Person and Government; and to offer our earness Prayers, that the Fleet may ever prove victorious under the Auspices of your

Majefty, and your Royal Family; and redound to the Glory of the Sovereign of the British Empire.

They were all received very graciously, and had the Honor to kiss the King's Hand; after which His Majesty was pleased to confer the Honor of Knighthood on John Carter, Esq; the Mayor of Portsmouth.

When the Levee was over, His Majefty returned to the Dock-Yard, and at Half an Hour after One o'Clock embarked in a Barge, in which His Royal Standard was immediately hoifted. The Earl of Sandwich, First Commissioner of the Admiralty; the Earl Delawar, Gold Stick; and Lord Robert Bertie, Lord of the Bed-Chamber in Waiting, embarked in the fame Boat with the King.

His Majesty then proceeded to Spithead, attended by the Barge of the Board of Admiralty, with the Flag of their Office, the Three Admirals with their Flags, and all the Captains of the Fleet with their Pendants in their Barges.

As His Majefty paffed the Garrifon, he was faluted by a Royal Salute of Twenty-one Guns from Blockhoufe Fort, Saluting Platform, and South-Sea Caftle.

When the Royal Standard was feen from the Fleet at Spithead, which confifted of Twenty Ships of the Line, Two Frigates, and Three Sloops, moored in two Lines abreaft of each other, the Whole manned Ship, and faluted with Twenty-one Guns each.

The King went on Board the Barfleur of 90 Guns, where he was received by the Board of Admiralty, the Captain being at the Head of the Accommodation-Ladder, and the Side manned by the Lieutenants of the Ships. As foon as His Majefty paffed the Guard of Marines on the Quarter-Deck, the Flag of the Lord High Admiral, which was then flying, was flruck, and the Royal Standard hoited at the Main-top-maft-head, the Lord High Admiral's Flag at the Fore-top-maft-head : On Sight of which, all the Ships, except the Barfleur, faluted with Twenty-one Guns each. The Ship being cleared the fame as for Action, and the Officers and Men at their refpective Quarters, His Majefty, after the Nobility who came off upon this Occasion, and the Flag-Officers, had paid their Duty to Him on the Quarter-Deck, walked fore and aft on the Lower Gun Deck, and took a View of the Whole.

At Half an Hour after Three o'Clock His Majefty fat down to a Table of Thirty Covers, at which many of the Nobility, and Perfons of Diftinction, as well as Officers of the Navy and Army of the Rank of Colonel and upwards, were admitted to the Honor of Dining. After Dinner, the Queen's Health being drank, the whole Fleet faluted with Twenty-one Guns; and, upon His Majefty's retiring from Table, the King's Health was likewife drank with the like Salute. And the fame was repeated every Day during His Majefty's Continuance at Portfmouth.

At Six o'Clock His Majefty went into His Barge, attended by the Board of Admiralty, the Flag Officera
