In the Upper Lusatia and near Leipzick the Field Vermin have also done considerable Damage. But it is still to be hoped, should the Months of July and August prove sine, that, after a Scarcity of Three Years, the Poor, by a more plentiful Harvest this Summer, may be supplied with better Bread, and at a more reasonable Price.

Berlin, July 10. The Weather continues still favourable, and unless we should have Rain during the Time of the Harvest, there is every Reason to

expect a plentiful Crop.
