St. James's, July 27.

The King has been pleased to appoint Henry Talbot, Esq; Sir John Gresham, Bart. Oliver Tilson, Milward Rowe, and John Hilleridon, Esqrs. to be His Majesty's Commissioners for the Receipt and Management of the Duties on Salt.

The King has been pleased to grant the Office of Surveyor-General of the Customs in the Port of London, unto the Right Honorable Thomas Baron Pelham, of Stanmer in the County of Sussex.
